This distinctive identity emerges from the very center and heart of the Church. The Spirit of Pentecost enables humanity to meet at the intersection of faith and culture; transforming the relativism, individualism, and commercialism of our various cultures.

Imagine the children of the world waking up to security in their countries and on their streets. Imagine adequate food and water, medical and educational access – Imagine: the list goes on and on. 
