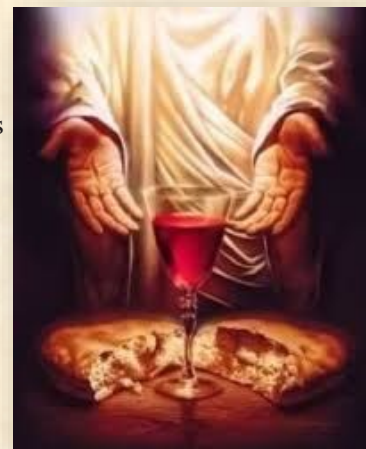
Although this happens with material objects, it also occurs in our relationships. Persons become disposable. For instance, in marriage a spouse can fulfill the desire and need for intimacy or happiness for a period of time, an object or instrument of my fulfillment or need, but disposable when no longer fulfilling ones immediate desires or even long range goals. The list is endless.

St. Augustine writes that “we are what we receive,” in the Eucharist. It is through our baptism that we are totally immersed into the life of Christ as God’s Beloved, and that immersion is deepened and intensified in the celebration of the Eucharist, continually transforming us into “that which we receive” - the Body of Christ. In Christ’s Spirit we are brought to life as God’s people, bringing our communal life toward a greater fulfillment.

The Mystical Body of Christ, the Church, has a human face in you and in me. We love in the name of Christ, we heal the broken-hearted in the name of Christ, and we forgive in the name of Christ. All that we do as a Church is in the name of Christ. It is the grace of the Holy Spirit that empowers us to do the work of Christ, not our own power or our own willfulness or our own designs. 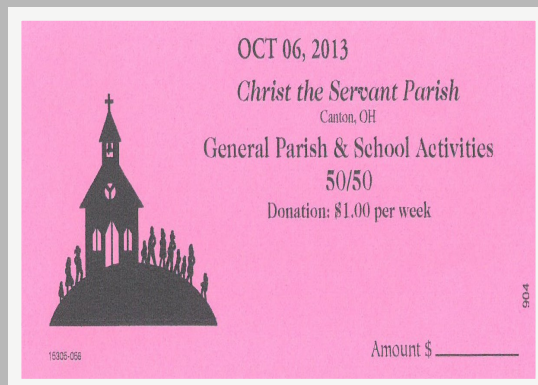
