Dear Beloved of Christ the Servant,

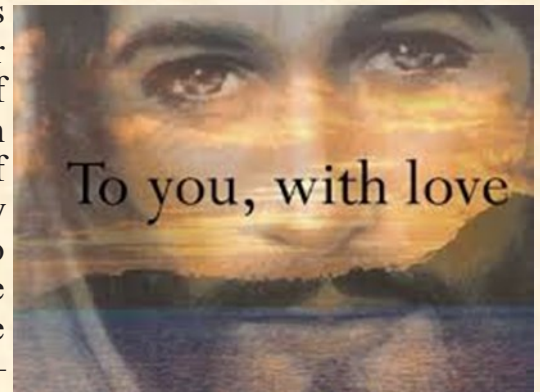

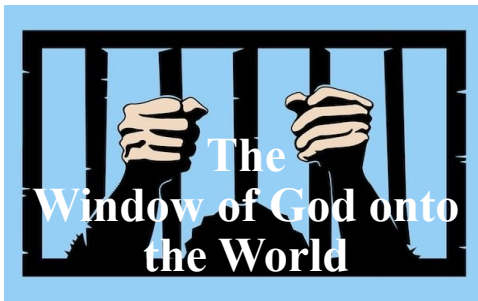

While our weekly Lenten Series, Let Us Dream: A Lenten Journey with Pope Francis has come to a close, we are energized by the following challenge from Pope Francis: “Each one of us is called to be an artisan of peace, by uniting, by extinguishing hatred, by opening paths of dialogue and not by constructing new walls.”

In his letter, Fratelli Tutti and his book Let Us Dream, Pope Francis addresses the pandemic and speaks to the feelings of isolation and despair. In Let Us Dream, Francis explores what this crisis can teach us about how to handle upheaval of any kind in our lives and the world at large. Here he talks candidly of three crises in his life or his three “Covid’s” – his illness and his experiences when he was assigned in Germany and Cordoba. He says crisis presents us with a choice. Either we can return to the pre-crisis state which would be a grievous error, or have the courage to change and emerge from the crisis a better person.

This is so relevant because most people we know are simply waiting for the pandemic to end and life to return to “normal,” which means the same as it was before. The hardships we went through during the pandemic would be wasted if we do not have the courage to change based on our experiences during the coronavirus epidemic.



As we emerge from our metaphorical tombs this Easter, may we look forward to new experiences, new challenges, new depths of faith, new ways of appreciating one another. As we reunite as a community, watch for ways to “transcend self,” reach out and get involved.

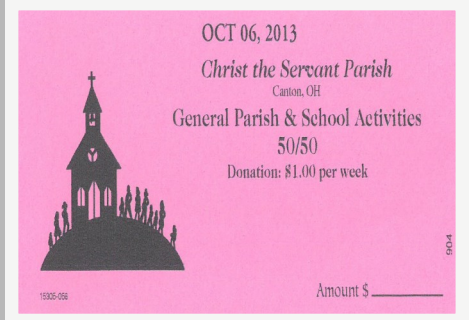
